INTRODUCTION

After studying, observing, and reflecting upon the lessons learnt and upon the Strategic Plan for several months, TBZ Management have adapted ideas to create a sequential design of a **Tobacco Management Manual** that reaches out to a diverse group of people within the Industry, and provide backstopping support to the Tobacco Inspectors as they under take their field extension work.


This is important because up until now, the Extension staff in tobacco industry did not have a manual which could be used as a guide during their day to day field activities.

This manual therefore, is designed to give on-the-spot advice and guide to users according to the time of the year. Such advice is almost always necessary while doing extension work in order not to lose focus. TBZ therefore have developed a twelve-step model that engages users by building on their experience and knowledge. The design provides many opportunities for anyone with a stake in tobacco industry to monitor the activity of the tobacco inspector in the field to ensure quality backstopping support by TBZ.

It is hoped that this Tobacco Management Manual will be used as reference material by first-time users as well as seasoned Extension Officers at the Ministry of Agriculture and indeed by all the players in this valued cash crop.

The booklet is divided in twelve activity sections, each of which is further subdivided in subsections that explain the processes at any given point.

It is our belief that the development of this manual will improve operations and alleviate some of the recurrent challenges experienced in the past by the Tobacco Inspectors as they perform their functions.


FUNCTIONS OF TBZ

TBZ undertakes the following functions and roles:

- i. Promote, protect and facilitate tobacco production and export of tobacco grown in the Republic;
- ii. Control and regulate the production, marketing and export of tobacco;
- iii. Carry out tobacco research;
- iv. Obtain and collate statistics relating to the production, marketing, manufacture and consumption of tobacco inside and outside the Republic;
- v. Promote and operate such services and other facilities as may be necessary or convenient for the tobacco industry;
- vi. Advise the Minister on all matters relating to the tobacco industry;
- vii. To do all things which the provision of the Tobacco Act CAP 237 and Tobacco Levy Act CAP 238 of the Laws of Zambia require to be done by the Board.

1. MONTH OF MAY

1.1 TOBACCO MARKETING WEEKLY REVIEW MEETINGS

The Tobacco Inspector (TI) working in collaboration with the TBZ Tobacco Classifier and Arbitrators and in consultation with the Buyers and growers should monitor how the Tobacco marketing is progressing and submit weekly reports on sales and any other issues that requires the attention of management. In those regions without the Sales Floors designate, the Regional Tobacco Inspectors (RTI) will ensure that they consult with the growers and buyers to understand what is happening on the market, the challenges and how these can be addressed and submit the same to Headquarters through the office of the Chief Operations Officer.

1.2 ISSUING OF TOBACCO MOVEMENT PERMITS

All tobacco destined for a sales floor designate should be accompanied with a Tobacco Movement Permit issued by the officer responsible for the area were tobacco originates. The Tobacco Inspectors (TI) should ensure that the Tobacco movement permits are only issued to those growers who have been registered, having a TBZ identification card and with a valid booking schedule from the Sales Floor Manager where tobacco is destined to be offered for sale. Under no circumstance should the tobacco be allowed to be transported to the sales floor designate without valid documentation showing that the tobacco will be bought by the intended buyer in line with the TBZ approved quota.

1.3 STALK DESTRUCTION

The TI's should ensure that all tobacco stalks, roots and any regrowth's are cleared from the tobacco lands and destroyed by either burning or ploughing-in and discing on or before **31**st **May** annually and this should be part of the weekly and monthly reporting. Growers who fail to adhere to this regulation are subject to prosecution in the

courts of Law as per the Plant Pests and Disease Act CAP 233 of the Laws of Zambia

1.4 FIRST TOBACCO SEED CERTIFICATION

The Research unit to provide information on the tobacco seed intended to be used for irrigation crop. The TI should know the type of tobacco, variety of seeds, hectares and the source of seed which will be grown under irrigation. The seeds should have the certification from the Seed Control and Certification institute. The TI should also have the record of all growers who intend to sow irrigated crop and their nursery preparations should be monitored.

1.5 FUEL-WOOD CUTTING AND STACKING

Tobacco inspectors to encourage growers to start fuel wood cutting, and the wood should be stacked near the barns. The number of standard cords (fuel wood) should be calculated based on the hectares to be planted. Standard fuel cord is measured by 1.2m x 1.2m x 2.4m (10-15 cords per hectare)

1.6 BARN CONSTRUCTION AND REHABILITATION

Tobacco inspectors to assist the growers to calculate the required barn space for the intended hectares to be planted. Existing barns have to undergo routine reconditioning so as to guarantee curing efficiency. Inspectors should encourage and train growers on how to construct fuel and heat efficient furnaces in order to conserve fuel wood resources. Ideally the following formula can be used to calculate the barn space required for one hectare.

Where: Y = Barns/Hectare

P = Plants/Hectare N = Leaves/Plant

T = Barn turn around time

S = Strings or Clips/Barn

L = Leaves/string or clip

R = Reaping interval days

1.7 TOBACCO GRADING AND MARKETING

Tobacco inspectors to conduct grading clinics and good tobacco hygiene in tobacco packaging. Marketing information should be disseminated to the growers. Farmers should be warned on malpractices such as tobacco nesting, presence of Non Tobacco Related Material (NTRM) and Illicit tobacco trade (Side marketing and tobacco vending).

1.8 APPLICATIONS FOR VARIOUS LICENCES

TBZ will advertise and invite applications for Tobacco Licences for Buyers' Tobacco Floor Managers/Sales floors and Graders for the upcoming marketing season.

1.9 ADVERTISEMENT OF TOBACCO LICENCES FOR BUYERS, FLOOR MANAGERS/SALES FLOORS AND GRADERS

TBZ will issue various Tobacco Licences for Buyers' Tobacco Floor Managers/Sales Floors and Graders for the upcoming marketing season.

2.0 MONTH OF JUNE

2.1 TOBACCO ACTIVITY MONTHLY REPORTS

The Tobacco Inspectors to provide information from their respective regions on various tobacco activities in their regions. E.g. marketing statistics, tobacco movements, farm and nursey inspections and grower registration for both irrigated and dryland crops.

2.2 TOBACCO REVIEW MEETINGS WITH STAKEHOLDERS

TBZ to hold review meetings with stakeholders to report on how the tobacco marketing is progressing and get feedback on all matters relating to marketing regulations of the tobacco industry as enshrined in the Tobacco Acts Cap 237 and 238 of the Laws of Zambia and other related laws.

2.3 REPORT ON SEED PLANTED UNDER IRRIGATION

The Research Unit working in collaboration with the TI's should give a status report on how much seed has been sown for the irrigated crop on the nurseries through weekly and monthly reports. The earliest date for sowing irrigated nurseries is **1**st **June**. With the use of the Motherbed and reset beds only can be done on 1st May.

2.4 REPORT ON GROWERS REGISTRATION

The TI's to report on the progress of the grower's registration and ensure that all new and old growers are registered with full crop information using the Brightleaf System and all these should be part of their weekly and monthly reports.

3.0 MONTH OF JULY

3.1 REPORTS ON MARKETING AND GROWERS REGISTRATION

TI's to report the tobacco marketing and growers' registration through weekly and monthly reports. The Research unit to consolidate all weekly and monthly reports from all regions and submit the report to management.

3.2 REPORTS ON CONTRACTS SIGNED BETWEEN GROWERS AND SPONSORING COMPANIES

All sponsoring/contracting companies should avail their sponsored growers' registers and contract details agreed upon between the company and the grower to TBZ regional offices and Headquarters offices for the information of TBZ.

3.3 TBZ MANAGEMENT MEETINGS

TBZ Management to hold a management meeting on tobacco related matters with inspectors in order to review the performance of the Tobacco Industry across the nation.

3.4 REPORT ON SECOND TOBACCO SEED CERTIFICATION

The Research unit should ensure that all sponsoring/contracting companies give a detailed report on the type of seed, variety, quantities of seed and source of seed (origin), which has been imported in the country for use for either research or production. The seed should also be certified and approved by the Seed Control and Certification Institute (SCCI) and hold valid Phytosanitary Certificates from the Country of Origin.

3.5 REPORT ON SEED GERMINATION FOR IRRIGATED CROPS.

The Tobacco Inspector should conduct inspections on all nurseries for irrigated crop and give a report on germination percentages through weekly and monthly reports

3.6 TBZ MEETING WITH BUYING COMPANIES

TBZ to hold a meeting with the tobacco buying companies to review the progress on the marketing and operational challenges in the tobacco industry.

3.7 LAND PREPARATION FOR IRRIGATED CROP

Inspectors to inspect lands for irrigated crops to ensure that all land preparation and ridging for irrigated crop is in progress and in readiness for transplanted in September through weekly and monthly reports.

3.8 NURSERY MANAGEMENT FOR IRRIGATED CROP

Inspectors to submit weekly and monthly reports of the inspections carried out on irrigated seedbeds for good management practices such as watering, mulching, weed control, spraying regimes, fertilization, hardening and clipping are being followed.

3.9 LAND PREPARATION FOR DRY LAND NURSERY

Inspectors to report and ensure that all land preparation for the nursery sites for dryland crop are completed by 31st July in readiness of sowing by 1st August. These should include levelling of the nursery beds as well as fencing of the nursery site.

3.10 NURSERY INPUTS DISTRIBUTION FOR DRYLAND CROP

Inspectors to ensure that all growers have received their nursery inputs (seed, chemical packs and fertilizer packs) from their sponsors/contractors in readiness for sowing in August and report the progress through weekly and monthly reports.

4.0 MONTH OF AUGUST

4.1 REPORTS ON MARKETING AND GROWERS REGISTRATION

TI's to report the tobacco marketing and growers' registration through weekly and monthly reports. The Research unit to consolidate all weekly and monthly reports from all regions and submit the report to management

4.2 REGIONAL MEETINGS WITH TOBACCO GROWERS AND STAKEHOLDERS

The TBZ management to hold regional meetings with tobacco growers and stakeholders to explain various issues and policies as well as to familiarize themselves with the activities and interventions being undertaken by growers to scale up tobacco production and improve the Tobacco Industry.

4.3 THIRD TOBACCO SEED CERTIFICATION

The Research unit should ensure that all sponsoring/contracting companies avail the quantities of seed which has been imported in the country. The seed should also be certified and approved by the Seed Control and Certification Institute (SCCI) and hold valid Phytosanitary Certificates from the Country of Origin.

4.4 REPORTS ON MANAGEMENT OF IRRIGATED NURSERIES

Inspectors to report and inspect irrigated nursery sites for good management practices such as watering, weed control, spraying regimes, fertilization, hardening and clipping.

4.5 LAND PREPARATION FOR IRRIGATED LANDS

Inspectors to ensure that all land preparation and ridging for irrigated crop is completed by August in readiness for early transplanting on **1**st **September**

4.6 REFORESTATION PROGRAMME

Inspectors to conduct reforestation trainings and ensure that tree planting is being done in their area of operation which will entail growers having enough fuel wood for curing and mitigate the effects of climate change. Fast growing and coppicing tree species are ideal for afforestation initiatives. Eucalyptus tree species are generally good tree species for curing, construction and timber. The earliest sowing date for eucalyptus tree species is **1**st **August**

5.0 MONTH OF SEPTEMBER

5.1 FINAL MEETING WITH TOBACCO BUYER'S AND TBZ

TBZ to hold a final meeting with tobacco buyers to get information on whether the Buyers have met their volumes, and other contractual obligations. TBZ to provide information on unbought tobacco if any to the buyers and during this meeting the closure of the tobacco marketing for the season will be decided through consultations.

5.2 REPORTS ON TOBACCO GROWERS REGISTRATION

The TI's to report on the progress of the growers' registration and ensure that all new and old growers are registered with full crop information using the Brightleaf System and all these should be part of their weekly and monthly reports.

5.3 REGISTERED GROWERS FROM SPONSORING/CONTRACTING COMPANIES

Sponsoring/Contracting companies should submit their tobacco growers registers to TBZ Inspectors for inspection and validation and uploading in the TBZ Brightleaf System.

5.4 REPORT ON SEED GERMINATION FOR DRYLAND CROPS.

The Tobacco Inspector should conduct inspections on all nurseries for dryland crop and give a report on germination percentages through weekly and monthly reports.

5.5 REPORTS ON TRANSPLANTING OF IRRIGATED CROP

The Tobacco inspectors should submit weekly and monthly reports on the activities regarding the transplanting of irrigated crop.

5.6 FIELD INPUTS DISTRIBUTION FOR DRYLAND CROP

Inspectors to ensure that all field inputs are with the growers and the distribution should end by **30**th **September**.

5.7 OFFICIAL CLOSING OF THE MARKETING SEASON

After TBZ has consulted with stakeholders on the closure date of marketing the Minister through TBZ shall announce the official closure of the tobacco sales of that particular marketing season.

6.0 THE MONTH OF OCTOBER

6.1 REPORTS ON MANAGEMENT OF DRYLAND NURSERIES

Inspectors to report and inspect irrigated nursery sites for good management practices such as watering, weed control, spraying regimes, fertilization, hardening and clipping.

6.2 INTERNATIONAL MEETINGS

TBZ and the strategic team should visit International markets so as to engage more buying companies and investors in the tobacco sector. Such visits will ideally increase information sharing on tobacco industry matters.

6.3 REPORTS ON FIELD MANAGEMENT FOR IRRIGATED CROP

Inspectors should report on field management activities such as fertilization, weeding. Pest & disease control through weekly and monthly reports

6.4 CLOSING OF GROWERS REGISTRATION

TBZ inspectors should ensure that all growers intending to grow tobacco in the Republic of Zambia are registered before the last closing date which is **31**st **October** as required by Law

6.5 ANNUAL OPERATIONAL REVIEW & PLANNING MEETING

All RTI's, and heads of departments at TBZ headquarters to present Annual operational progress reports and activity budgets for the coming operational year.

7.0 MONTH OF NOVEMBER

7.1 FIELD REPORTS ON IRRIGATED CROPS

The tobacco Inspector should submit a comprehensive report on total number of hectares planted, number of growers participating and expected yield through weekly and monthly reports for all the tobacco under irrigation and the Research unit to consolidate the national figures under irrigation.

7.2 THE FINAL TOBACCO SEED GERMINATION ON THE DRYLAND CROPS

All tobacco inspector should submit the final seed germination reports from their areas of operation as well as the hectares on the progress of the transplanted dryland crop to Headquarters for consolidation by the Research unit.

7.3 REGIONAL VISITATION

The TBZ Management to conduct regional visits to understand and share new developments in the tobacco industry as well as get feedback from all the tobacco growers and stakeholders on how to improve the tobacco industry.

8.0 MONTH OF DECEMBER

8.1 FINAL GROWERS REGISTRATION APPROVAL

All registered tobacco growers will be allocated with a TBZ registration number and a valid identification card upon verification by the Tobacco Inspectors. TBZ will submit the preliminary register by 31st December.

8.2 REPORT ON PLANT POPULATION AND HECTRAGE

Tobacco Inspectors to report on number of growers registered, crop type, farmer category, expected yield, plant population and hectares grown as indicated in the TBZ Brightleaf System for both irrigated and dryland tobacco crop and the Research unit to consolidate the **National First Crop Forecast** of the projected volume for the country.

8.3 NURSERY SITE CLEARING AND DESTRUCTION

The TI's should report and inspect all nurseries of both irrigated and dryland crop and ensure that any living tobacco plants in the nursey site for the current season's crop is destroyed by ploughing-in and discing by **31st December** by the grower.


8.4 LAST DATE FOR TRANSPLANTING OF TOBACCO

Inspectors to ensure and educate the all tobacco growers that no tobacco is transplanted after **31**st **December.**

9.0 MONTH OF JANUARY

9.1 REPORTS ON PRODUCTION

Tobacco inspectors to report on how the tobacco crop is growing in the lands for both irrigated and dryland crops. These should include, the tobacco crop for sponsored/contracted and selfsponsored crop. The Research unit should consolidate figures and report management. For the contracted crop this should be done in collaboration with the sponsor/contractor.



9.2 REPORTS ON PHYSICAL VALIDATION

The duration of the physical validation and approval of registered growers by the Board shall be 1st January to 31st March in each year.

9.3 FIELD DAYS ON TOBACCO FIELD MANAGEMENT

Inspectors to conduct TBZ field days and demonstration on farmers and research plots on approved new field management technics. For the sponsored crop this should be done in collaboration with the sponsoring/contracting company.

9.4 REAPING AND CURING FOR THE IRRIGATED CROP

Tobacco inspectors to report on the reaping and curing activities in their respective areas of operations.

10.0 THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY

10.1 FINAL REPORT ON TOBACCO PRODUCTION

The tobacco inspectors should submit their final crop forecast to the Research unit for consolidation of the National Final crop production forecast. This assessment will include the irrigated and dryland crops from both sponsored/contracted and self-sponsored growers. The collection of data in the field should be done in collaboration with the sponsor/contractor.

10.2 FINAL MEETING BETWEEN TBZ AND BUYERS

TBZ and tobacco buying companies to hold a meeting and consolidate the volumes of both sponsored/contracted and self-sponsored crop for market readiness.

10.3 FIRST MEETING ON PRODUCTION COST

TBZ Management and inspectors under the coordination of the Research unit shall hold the meeting to come up with the cost of production before meeting with the stakeholders.

11.0 MONTH OF MARCH

11.1 GRADING CLINICS BY TOBACCO INSPECTORS

Tobacco inspectors to conduct grading clinics in their areas of operation before commencement of marketing.

11.2 SECOND MEETING ON COST OF PRODUCTION

TBZ Management to hold a second meeting with sponsoring companies and Buyers to agree on cost of production. This is for the information of TBZ and the Ministry of Agriculture.

11.3 SUBMISSION OF PRICE MATRIX BY TOBACCO BUYERS

TBZ Management shall receive price matrices in confidence from all buying companies at least five (5) days before announcement of tobacco marketing date. This is for the information of TBZ and the Ministry of Agriculture

11.4 MARKET PREPARATION

Tobacco inspectors to inspect all approved tobacco sales floor designates and warehouses for readiness of the market opening.

12.0 MONTH OF APRIL

12.1 GROWER REGISTRATION

All tobacco growers are required to register as tobacco growers every year and it is Law as stipulated in the Tobacco Act Cap 237 of Laws of Zambia. The period of commencement of Tobacco grower's registration in all the regions of tobacco shall be from 1st April to 31st October in each year. Any registration after 31st October each year will be a late registration. The validity of registration shall be the period ending 30th September of the following year.

The Tobacco Inspector will ensure that all the registered growers have the pictures of their **National Registration Card** captured, their farm land allocated the **GPS Coordinates**, the prescribed **class of tobacco** and the intended **hectares** to be grown by the grower are recorded. Where a grower is sponsored or contracted the prospective volume sponsored or contracted and the name of the sponsoring or contracting company should be recorded.

12.2 OPENING OF THE TOBACCO MARKETING SEASON

The Minister through the Board shall announce the official date of opening the tobacco marketing season.
